The Position

The City of San Bruno is currently seeking an energetic and dedicated leader to serve as Fire Marshal (Non-Suppression Administrative Battalion Chief), who will lead and manage fire prevention initiatives. The Fire Marshal will have an opportunity to work on exciting projects, including managing the YouTube/Google facilities expansion and the anticipated redevelopment along the Transit Corridors Plan, for a revitalized commercial corridor around the City's downtown area. In addition to working with developers to ensure fire safety systems, the Fire Marshal will also aid consultants with the City's new development impact fees, which will generate revenue for future Fire Department initiatives. This position works a **40-hour schedule** or other work schedule as dictated by the needs of the Department.

Under the direction of the Fire Chief, the Fire Marshal manages fire prevention activities for the City of San Bruno. These duties include, but are not limited to, managing effective fire prevention initiatives, implementing public education programs, administering the fire prevention budget, supervising a permit services center, managing the fire prevention records management system, coordinating code enforcement, overseeing review of building construction and fire protection system plans for conformance to fire and life safety standards, coordinating fire prevention training, and performing other duties as assigned. In addition to the assigned division, the Battalion Chief acts as a significant role model for the department through leading by example, supporting and implementing professional management standards, and actively taking part in grooming future leaders.

The San Bruno Fire Department is dedicated to the protection of health, life and property, and has a long standing tradition of service and excellence. The Fire Department provides a full range of services and places priority on the safety and emergency preparedness of our citizens through outreach programs in fire prevention, public education, advanced life support, hazardous material safety, and fire suppression activities.

Minimum Qualifications

- Minimum 10 years of increasingly responsible experience with at least 3 years of command experience comparable to the Fire Captain level in San Bruno
- Graduation from an accredited college or university with a BA/BS in Fire Science, Business Administration, Public Administration or closely related field, or an AA/AS degree or completion of 60 college units with Fire Officer Certification and completion of Chief Officer Certification within one (1) year of appointment

Special Requirements

- Possession of and ability to maintain a valid Class B or C driver's license with Firefighter endorsement
- Possession of and ability to maintain a valid California EMT- Basic or EMT -Paramedic license
- Wildland Fire Behavior (S-290) and Strike Team Leader (S-330) courses are desirable.
