- Implement actions in Environmental Sustainability Action Plan 3, including a community solar PV ordinance and a higher municipal green building standard, and greenhouse gas analysis/projections
- Assist with implementing an over-arching sustainability outreach campaign focused on encouraging behavior change and property upgrades among residents, businesses/developers, and municipal employees
- Conduct research and develop a plan for installing additional EV chargers in Mountain View
- Support municipal building energy efficiency and renewable energy efforts, including (1) managing a project to install additional solar PV, (2) investigating the use of solar hot water, (3) developing a sustainability revolving loan fund program, and (4) identifying and implementing an energy/GHG reporting platform
