About This Role

We are seeking a highly motivated, highly organized, innovative and enthusiastic individual to join the Public Works Department for the position of Associate Engineer or Senior Civil Engineer in the Engineering & Environmental Compliance section. This is a single vacancy position and may be filled as an Associate Engineer or Senior Civil Engineer depending on the skills and experience of the ideal candidate. This position combines the technical knowledge of engineering with the art and vision of planning and design to deliver high quality projects for the vibrant City of Mountain View. While reporting to the Principal Engineer, this position works closely with other City Departments and Public Works Sections (Capital Projects and Construction) and is responsible for all aspects of project management for improvement, rehabilitation, and/or major repairs of a variety of City owned buildings. No two projects are alike and some potential projects that the individual could work on include sustainability projects (solar panels, electric vehicle charging stations, and energy efficiency upgrades), ADA accessibility improvements, tenant improvements (restaurant tenant), various building upgrades, and various roof replacement projects. The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining the City's various buildings (City Hall, Center for Performing Arts, Library, Senior Center, Community Center, Sports Pavilion, Police and Fire Stations, etc.); operating and maintaining the utilities (water, wastewater and recycled water systems) and closed landfill; managing the City's transportation system (roadways and traffic signals); managing and implementing the City's Capital Improvement Program; managing and coordinating a variety of private development projects including high tech, transit oriented and residential subdivision projects; ensuring the safe, efficient and convenient circulation of vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic throughout the community; maintaining City buildings and the City's vehicle and equipment fleet; and administering the City's Solid Waste and Real Estate Management programs. The Department's crews, technicians, engineers, managers, and other staff are proud of their contributions which make Mountain View a great place to live, work and visit.

- An exceptional **communicator** with superior interpersonal and writing skills who can interact professionally with both City staff and consultants while providing outstanding customer service.
- A **skilled** industry professional who possesses technical knowledge in the area of project management for public sector capital projects.
- A respectful **team player** who thrives in a collaborative, fast-paced work environment and is able to able to build consensus with a variety of stake holders including contractors, residents and other City departments.
- A **multi-tasker** adept at managing multiple projects and deadlines simultaneously, with the ability to prioritize assignments effectively.
- A **problem-solver** who confronts issues, evaluates multiple alternatives, and makes strategic decisions.

What You'll Do

- Provide technical and administrative leadership for City facilities improvement, rehabilitation, and major repair projects.
- Consult with project stakeholders to develop project goals, objectives and priorities and establish project schedules.
- Develop scope of work and terms and prepare request for proposals (RFP) for consultant and contractors, reviewing each awarded contract and making recommendations.
- Develop, prepare, administer and manage project budgets and schedules.
- Prepare and review project plans, specifications and cost estimates, including the preparation of bid schedules and general and special provisions relevant to each project.
- Collaborate with and manage a variety of consultants (architectural and engineering) as necessary.
- Prepare public outreach information and deliver presentations to the public, Council committees and City Council.
- Identify and apply for project grants, and ensure compliance with reporting requirements.
- Serve as the department liaison to other City departments during all project phases.
- Develop project status reports and City Council reports for all project concerns, including contract approvals, funding and acceptance.

The Fine Print

*Associate Engineer or Senior Civil Engineer - *this is a three-year limited period assignment. Funding is anticipated for the entire 3-year period; however it is subject to council adoption of the budget in June 2020 and June 2021. Any extensions beyond the limited-term period listed may be reviewed and approved by the City based on budget sustainability and the on-going operational needs of the department.
