What's the role?

The ideal candidate would have a background in recycling and waste reduction programs and policy. You will join a fast-paced, dynamic team environment, providing SERVICES within the Transportation and Business Services Division of the Public Works Department. Selected individual must be equipped to work remotely or on-site at the City of Mountain View (City Hall) with the internship starting in May or June 2022. Working conditions are subject to change depending on public health orders.

This is a part-time paid position, up to 29 hours per week and does not include benefits. The Intern position is a temporary assignment through summer 2022. These positions include flexible scheduling and college/university credit may be provided, as applicable. Interns receive direction and guidance from an intern host who is part of the management staff.

- Familiarity with circular economy principles and practices.



An internship with the City of Mountain View offers valuable, real-world job experience in one of California's best-managed cities! Through this internship, you will gain exposure to a wide variety of programs and services, while enhancing and sharpening your writing, presentation, research, analytical, and critical thinking skills. This experience will also be supplemented with training workshops, networking with other interns, and access to professionals in your interested field, both within the City of Mountain View and through external events.

Fine Print. Depending on the number of applications, the above process may be altered.
