The Behavioral Health Clinician I/II performs a variety of professional duties in the provision of outpatient and crisis behavioral health services to individuals and groups. This person will work with complex casework which may include clinics, criminal justice, adult services, youth and family services, and other mental health settings where they may be asked to respond to crisis situations, work with case managers and psychiatrists in treatment teams and be familiar with various treatment modalities to ensure clients are in appropriate treatment services. The position is scheduled for forty (40) hours per week.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will need to work well within a team setting and have therapeutic skills to help problem-solve and make immediate decisions about challenging therapeutic cases.

JOB DUTIES

- Provides individual, group, and family counseling on a variety of mental health problems and substance use disorders; develops treatment plans; provides follow-up counseling and assists patients with the resolution of problems.
- Observes patients on-site at schools, etc., as necessary; conducts home visits as necessary. Participates in outreach activities, providing information to the community regarding prevention, intervention, and education.
- Provides psychotherapy to children and adult clients or their relatives through individual or group therapy methods.
- Receives referrals from the courts or other individuals or organizations regarding individuals requiring treatment services; develops and implements treatment programs.
