


# Welcome to Fairfax, California

### The Position

### Key Responsibilities

The Director of Public Works will oversee a diverse range of projects and responsibilities, including:

- Infrastructure & Capital Improvement Projects: Planning and execution of road, bridge, stormwater, and facility improvements.
- Public Works Operations & Maintenance: Management of roads, sidewalks, storm drains, parks, playgrounds, and public buildings.
- Regulatory Compliance & Environmental Initiatives: Ensuring adherence to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and local climate action goals.
- Budget & Grant Management: Developing the department's budget and securing funding through regional state and federal grants.
- Collaboration & Community Engagement: Working with regional agencies, commissions, and local organizations to improve public infrastructure.

## Qualifications and Experience

### **Education & Experience**

- Bachelor's degree in civil engineering, or a related field (required).
- Minimum of three (3) years of experience in municipal engineering, public works, or a related department.
- Experience in a public agency preferred, but private sector candidates with relevant expertise will be considered.
- Professional Engineer (PE) license in California is highly desirable.

### **Additional Requirements**

- Valid California driver's license required.
- Ability to develop budgets, oversee contracts, and manage public infrastructure projects.

This at-will position has a competitive salary of \$14,908 to \$17,258 per month, with scheduled increases in subsequent years.
