

Process Control Technician - \$82,555.20 - \$100,360.00/annually

The Process Control Technician performs a variety of technical and professional engineering duties related to the design, installation, set-up, programming, troubleshooting and maintenance of hardware, software and instrumentation associated with the District's Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems.

They support Operations and Maintenance by troubleshooting, researching, designing, purchasing, and installing field instrumentation, programmable logic controller (PLC), operator interface terminals (OIT), variable speed drives, electrical systems, and other appurtenances. The Process Control Technician provides PLC and OIT programming and installation support making programming changes as required for the efficient operation of new and existing District facilities.

Qualifications

Any combination of training, education and experience which demonstrates possession of the knowledge and abilities stated above and the ability to perform the duties of the position.

Experience and Education

- Graduation from high school or equivalent, supplemented by college or equivalent course work in engineering, electronics, instrumentation, control systems, and/or computer systems.
- Two years of increasingly responsible experience involving the configuration and programming of process control, instrumentation and operator interface terminals.
- A Bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering or a closely related field from an accredited college or university is desirable.

Licenses and Certification

- Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver License with a satisfactory driving record to maintain insurability.
- Possession of a State Water Resources Control Board Distribution Operator Certification for Grade D1 is desirable.

Benefits

Retirement - Solano Irrigation District participates in the California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS).

- Classic CalPERS Members - benefits include equivalency of 2%@60 formula with the following provisions: final compensation is the monthly average of highest 36 consecutive months; and credit for unused sick leave. Employee pays 7% Employee Contribution.

- New CalPERS Members – benefits include equivalency of 2%@62 formula with the following provisions: three-year final compensation period used to calculate the average final compensation; and credit for unused sick leave. Employee pays 6.75% Employee Contribution.

Deferred Compensation - 457 plan available. Employee may defer up to the annual maximum, as outlined by the IRS, on a tax-deferred basis.

Health Insurance - Plans include Anthem Blue Cross HMO and PPO plans and a Kaiser Permanente plan. The District pays a portion of the premium for employee and dependent coverage.

Dental Insurance - Dental provider is Premier Access Dental. District pays full premium for both employee and dependents.

Life Insurance - Benefit is equal to 2x annual base salary rounded to the next higher \$1,000, up to a maximum of \$300,000. Premium is paid by the District.
